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- Salary: Effective September 1, 2018, the stipend paid for a half (H) course is \$8,160 for a Sessional Lecturer I, \$8,568 for a Sessional Lecturer II, \$8,772 for a Sessional Lecturer III, and \$8,364 for a Sessional Lecturer I Long Term.
